- The above Standalone and Consolidated Ind AS Financial Results were reviewed by Audit Committee and subsequently approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held today. The Statutory auditors have conducted a limited, review of the above unaudited financial results and have expressed an unmodified report on the same.
- The above Consolidated Financial Results of Mirza International Limited (The Company) and its Wholly Owned Subsidiaries (WOS) T N S Hotels and Resorts Private Limited and RTS Fashion Ltd. are drawn in terms of Regulation 33 of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015.
- 3 The statement have been prepared in accordance with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind As) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognized accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.
- The format of above Financial Results as prescribed in SEBI's Circular CIR/CFD/CMD/15/2015 dated November 30, 2015 has been modified to Comply with the requirements of SEBI's Circular CIR/CFD/FAC/62/2016 dated July 05, 2016.
- Company has already adopted Ind AS 116 in respect of its lease assets In order to align with the Ind AS 116, Company preferred to recognise all its lease hold assets as per Ind AS 116. Due to adoption of Ind AS 110 cent Expenses is reduced by Rs. 11.21 Lacs, whereas depreciation & finance cost is up by Rs. 9.31 Lacs & Rs.9.95 Lacs & Gain on lease modification of 4.55 Lakh respectively with company has reassessed the Asset/Liabilities under Ind AS 116 "Leases", resulting into increase in profit before tax of Rs. 3.50 Lacs for the quarter ended on 31.03.2024.

- In the consolidated financial results, Company has already adopted Ind AS 116 in respect of its lease assets. In order to align with the Ind AS 116, Company preferred to recognise all its lease hold assets as per Ind AS 116. Due to adoption of Ind AS 116, rent Expenses is reduced by Rs. 12.13 Lacs, whereas depreciation & finance cost is up by Rs. 10.40 Lacs & Rs.10.88 Lacs, & Gain on lease modification of 4.55 respectively & the company has reassessed the Asset/Liabilities under Ind AS 116 "Leases", resulting into Increase in profit before tax of Rs. 4.62 Lacs for the quarter ended on 31.03.2024.
- 7 Company has already adopted Ind AS 116 in respect of its lease assets In order to align with the Ind AS 116, Company preferred to recognise all its lease hold assets as per Ind AS 116. Due to adoption of Ind AS 116, rent Expenses is reduced by Rs. 46.51 Lacs, whereas depreciation & finance cost is up by Rs. 37.66 Lacs & Rs.39.98 Lacs & Gain on lease modification of 4.55 Lakh respectively & the company has reassessed the Asset/Liabilities under Ind AS 116 "Leases", resulting into increase in profit before tax of Rs. 26.58 Lacs for the year ended on 31.03.2024.
- In the consolidated financial results, Company has already adopted Ind AS 116 in respect of its lease assets. In order to align with the Ind AS 116, Company preferred to recognise all its lease hold assets as per Ind AS 116. Due to adoption of Ind AS 116, rent Expenses is reduced by Rs. 50.22 Lacs, whereas depreciation & finance cost is up by Rs. 42.30 Lacs & Rs.43.67 Lacs, & Gain on lease modification of 4.55 respectively & the company has reassessed the Asset/Liabilities under Ind AS 116 "Leases", resulting into Increase in profit before tax of Rs. 31.19 Lacs for the year ended on 31.03.2024.
- 9 The Board of Directors of the Company proposed a Scheme of Amalgamation of T N S Hotels and Resorts Pvt Ltd with and into Mirza International Ltd. The requisite Company Petition [being CP (CAA) 20/ALD of 2023; connected with CA (CAA) 21/ALD of 2023] has been filed with the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Allahabad Bench, Prayagraj for approval of the aforesaid Scheme of Amalgamation jointly by both the Companies. The Petition is pending with the Hon'ble NCLT.

  It may be noted that the Transferor Company-T N S Hotels and Resorts Pvt Ltd is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Transferee Company-Mirza International Ltd. Hence, no new share will be issued pursuant to the Scheme of Amalgamation. Hence, there will not be any change in the issued share capital of Mirza International Ltd pursuant to the proposed amalgamation.
- The Company has received four orders under GST law on highly debatable issue, though the company filed explanation before the adjudication officer during assessment stage and consequent to the impugned order aggregate liability of Rs. 56.12 Crores have raised but the company has filed appeals before the first appellate authority (Competent Authority). The management has been advised that the issue under appeals are not sustainable in law hence, no provision is required in accounts in this regard.

## Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

### **Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of Mirza International Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), the Statement of Changes in Equity and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended on that date, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information. (hereinafter referred to as "the standalone financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, ("Ind AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2024, the profit and total comprehensive income, changes in equity and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

## Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit of the standalone financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act (SAs). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the standalone financial statements.



## **Emphasis of Matter**

We draw attention to Note No. 2 of the standalone financial statements with respect to the Scheme of Amalgamation of T N S Hotels and Resorts Pvt Ltd with Mirza International Ltd: The Board of Directors of the Company proposed a Scheme of Amalgamation of T N S Hotels and Resorts Pvt Ltd with and into Mirza International Ltd. The requisite Company Petition [being CP (CAA) 20/ALD of 2023; connected with CA (CAA) 21/ALD of 2023] has been filed with the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Allahabad Bench, Prayagraj for approval of the aforesaid Scheme of Amalgamation jointly by both the Companies. The Petition is pending with the Hon'ble NCLT.

It may be noted that the Transferor Company-T N S Hotels and Resorts Pvt Ltd is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Transferee Company-Mirza International Ltd. Hence, no new share will be issued pursuant to the Scheme of Amalgamation. Hence, there will not be any change in the issued share capital of Mirza International Ltd pursuant to the proposed amalgamation.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

## **Key Audit Matters**

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the standalone financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the standalone financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters. We have determined the matters described below to be the key audit matters to be communicated in our report.

The Company's Management and Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation of the other information. ## Report on the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Statements

## Opinion

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of Mirza International Limited (hereinafter referred to as the 'Holding Company') and its subsidiaries (Holding Company and its subsidiaries together referred to as "the Group"), which comprise the Consolidated Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024, the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), the Consolidated Statement of Changes in Equity and the Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended on that date, and notes to the consolidated financial statements, including summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the Consolidated financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, and based on the consideration of reports of other auditor on separate financial statements of such subsidiaries as were audited by the other auditor, the aforesaid Consolidated financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, ("Ind AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the consolidated state of affairs of the Group, as at March 31, 2024, the consolidated profit and other comprehensive income, consolidated changes in equity and its consolidated cash flows for the year ended on that date.

#### Basis for opinion

The requisite Company Petition [being CP (CAA) 20/ALD of 2023; connected with CA (CAA) 21/ALD of 2023] has been filed with the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Allahabad Bench, Prayagraj for approval of the aforesaid Scheme of Amalgamation jointly by both the Companies. The Petition is pending with the Hon'ble NCLT.

It may be noted that the Transferor Company-T N S Hotels and Resorts Pvt Ltd is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Transferee Company-Mirza International Ltd. Hence, no new share will be issued pursuant to the Scheme of Amalgamation. Hence, there will not be any change in the issued share capital of Mirza International Ltd pursuant to the proposed amalgamation.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

## **Key Audit Matters**

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the consolidated financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the consolidated financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.
